### INTRODUCTION

Trash Handlers Limited recognizes that our success is deeply intertwined with the well-being of the communities we serve. ### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT OVERVIEW

Our programs reached: • 25 schools with waste management curriculum integration • 2,000 students participating in recycling education workshops • 500 teachers trained in environmental education methods • 15 community centers offering waste segregation training • Development of educational materials in local languages
